Listening Like A Child



子供のように聞いてみよう

Children learn language by listening. A child discovers every new word and grammar structure only by listening. Listening properly is a key to becoming confident with any language. Every child can do it, and so can you. Did you know that your class listening activities copy how children listen and learn language? Let's explain:

1. Why do we have quizzes? 聞き取り演習には、どうしてクイズがありますか?

Listening questions are not tests. The questions are to make listening *easier*, because they focus you on information you need, not every word. Think of a child listening to his parents discuss his birthday party. He will NOT ask himself 1) "what are my parents saying?" but 2) "what time is the cake?" The child will definitely answer question 2, and be unable to answer question 1.*So listen like a child: don't try to understand everything, just answer the questions.*

2. Why do we check our answers in pairs before listening again? I don't have the answer! どうしてクイズの答えをペアでチェックする必要がありますか?

Again, this makes the second listening *easier*. If the child doesn't hear what time the cake is served, she will definitely ask. If a child is unsure of the time, she will ask another child. If both children have the same answer, their language confidence is improved. Everybody is happy; no-one is wrong. Checking our listening is a natural part of conversation from an early age. *So listen like a child: check your answers by using the Classroom English handout.*

3. If I ask a question, does it interrupt the lesson? 私が質問をすれば、授業を中断してしまいますか?

No, in fact asking questions shows that you are listening! Think about when you read a child a story - if they ask lots of questions about the words and characters and pictures, you know they are learning. If they are sitting silently, they are probably bored. Teachers know that the students who interrupt the lesson are learning the quickest, and those sitting quietly are learning much less. So listen like a child: interrupt the lesson, ask questions about words, and shout out "what was that?" or "why did he say that?" as often as you like!

4. If I get the wrong answer, am I a bad student? 答えを間違えるのは、悪いことですか?

No. Is the birthday child 'bad' if he mishears the time for the cake? No, but he will cry if he gets no cake. So it's up to his parents and friends (teachers and classmates) to help him understand, and get some cake in the end. Which is why we have quizzes, peer checks, and question times. But if he has the wrong answer at first...who cares? *So listen like a child: focus on getting the cake, not on getting 'the right answer'.*





Gold Award

Title: Martin Luther King Author: Cobeen Degnan-Veness Level: 3

Plot: Martin Luther King was born in 1929 in the American South. He became a Baptist preacher. But he wasn't just a preacher. He had a dream. He wanted blacks and whites to live together happily.

But in America in the 1950s and 1960s people were not equal. King lead peaceful protests against the government, and won change for the blacks of America. But he was murdered in 1968.

Title: Nothing but the Truth **Author:** George Kershaw

Level: 4 (Intermediate)

Plot: Hu is a 17-year-old female student at an international school in Bangkok. She intends to become a doctor because her father wants her to. She has a problem with her English teacher, Mr. Stanyer.

Mr. Stanyer fabricates the results of her exams in order to offer her extra English lessons for fees after school. Hu is not able to refuse his offer because she has to get good enough exam results to go to medical school. Hu doesn't want to tell her father the bad exam results and disappoint him. That's why she keeps it secret.

But at last she tells the school counselor and her parents about her problem. Hu and her parents are called in to the principal's office.
