#### Vacation adventures

Well, it's summer time. Traditionally a time to go on vacation – school is out, Kyoto is too hot – a perfect time to escape your everyday life and get some new experiences!

Have you ever been on an adventurous vacation? Have you ever been somewhere that made you feel worried or scared? Do you have any stories of staying in strange places?

I thought I'd tell you about a trip I made a long time ago. I was travelling in Indonesia and some backpackers told me about an island called Siberut. They said you could trek through the jungle and stay with the local tribespeople, the Mentawai. It sounded interesting so I joined a small tour. There

were 10 of us, and we took a ferry to the island. After lunch, we got into dugout canoes with outboard engines and went up the river for a few hours. We soon left the town behind and the jungle got thicker and thicker. We saw a few people fishing in dugouts, and women by the riverside washing clothes. Our engine had problems, but we finally arrived at a small village. We had a two-hour trek to





reach the place we would stay. At first it was easy to walk, with a nice dry path, but after 30 minutes we were really in the jungle. The ground was so wet that the path was made of tree trunks that had been cut down. If you fell off, you landed in a lot of mud! We saw giant centipedes and dangerous biting ants. We arrived at a small river. There were two ways across – throw your bag over and wade across, or cross the 'bridge' – one wobbly 4m long bamboo pole! We all waded across! Finally, we arrived at the place we would stay. It was a single hut in the jungle. There were chickens and pigs living under the hut. The hut was made of

wood and had one large room. In the middle of the room was a fire and some pots for cooking. Around the walls there were lots of monkey skulls (after the tribespeople ate the monkeys they displayed the skulls to thank the gods for the food). The family didn't need money, so we paid them with sugar, salt, tobacco and rice. After dinner (rice, vegetables, eggs) we slept on mats on the wood floor. It wasn't very comfortable! Apparently, a large snake crossed the room while we were sleeping! After breakfast we all jumped in a river to wash but there were leeches so after





washing we used a cigarette lighter to get them off our bodies! And the toilet? Hide behind a tree and use a stick to keep the pigs away. That day we learned how the family made spears and poison arrows for hunting, how they made clothing from a tree, and how they did their tattoos. They also showed us some plants they used for medicine. The next day we said goodbye and went back. Two of us decided to cross the river on the bamboo pole. We were following a local woman carrying a big bag, and she just walked across, so we did, too. Easy! It was an amazing trip and I would recommend it – as long as you don't mind leeches, biting ants, crazy pigs, snakes, and getting wet and muddy!

Pick your poison - ask someone to choose the drink they would like


Toasting language - Raise a glass to .. / Let's drink to .. / I'd like to make a toast to ..
