Seagull	The large grey and white bird often seen at beaches
Boardwalk	A wooden path along the beach. There may be shops along it
Shore	Where the sea and sand meet is the shore
Coast	All the land that is next to the sea/ocean
Driftwood	Pieces of wood on the beach that were in the sea a long time
Dock	A structure that goes from the shore into the sea. Boats stop there
Pier	A pier is bigger and longer than a dock
Lighthouse	A tall building with a big light to show boats where land is
Tidal pool	A rocky area where sea water stays when the tide goes out
Sandcastle	Children often make castle shapes with buckets of sand
Life preserver	You may wear it to keep your head above water if you can't swim
Lifeguard	A person whose job is to keep people in the sea safe
Snorkle	You can use this pipe and goggles to swim and look under water
Coral	It looks like stone and is made of thousands of small living things
Tide	The rise and fall of sea water every day because of the moon
